


A NIGHT IN WONDERLAND

Duck into a hip café to try what locals insist is the best coffee in the world. Cap off your day with a steam train ride through the lush rainforest and rolling mountains just outside the city.

PERTH (FREMANTLE), AUSTRALIA

With an average of eight hours of sunshine per day, Perth is one of the world's sunniest cities. Breathtaking Bali is an interesting mix of modern and traditional. Once a remote destination that could be reached only with a fair amount of effort, the island has become a haven for serenity seekers from around the world. Part of its draw is spiritual – there are gorgeous Hindu temples throughout the island, and the town of Ubud in particular has become a centre for yoga practitioners. For a special treat, hire a guide and visit the Jatiluwih Rice Terraces, a gorgeous UNESCO World Heritage site that demonstrates how harmoniously man and nature can interact.

TOKYO, JAPAN

1 OVERNIGHT | 18-19 MARCH 2022

Tokyo perfectly combines reverence for tradition with cutting-edge technology and culture, so you will want to visit the ancient shrines and formal gardens as well as the modern Tokyo Tower that soars above it all. You can expect to encounter a lot of people in a city of around 14 million, but you can also find quiet spots in which to relax, such as lovely Ueno Park. Visit the temple, eat sushi, sing karaoke, buy a kimono and embrace this fascinating city.



KYOTO (KOBE), JAPAN


1 OVERNIGHT | 21-22 MARCH 2022

Packed with 17 UNESCO World Heritage sites, Japan's delightful imperial capital of Kyoto is less than 80 kilometres from the port of Kobe, which is also close to other wonderful sights. The more ancient imperial capital of Nara has its own share of UNESCO sites nearby, while the gilded tigers adorning Osaka Castle can be found even closer to the port. Kobe itself also has plenty to offer, from parks and museums to chic restaurants serving the city's succulent namesake beef.

SHANGHAI, CHINA

1 OVERNIGHT | 30-31 MARCH 2022

Standing on The Bund gazing across the Huangpu River to a forest of skyscrapers, it will be hard to believe that a few decades ago there was barely a building over ten stories here. While the global economy has transformed Shanghai's skyline, you can still find history and culture during a quiet moment in the 16th-century Yuyuan Garden. For the hip and modern, head to M50, a collection of factories and cotton mills that have been turned into galleries, and view works of established and emerging Chinese artists.



HONG KONG, CHINA

1 OVERNIGHT | 3-4 APRIL 2022

Only in Hong Kong can you wander through a magical flower tunnel hidden in a housing complex, ride the world's longest escalator, stand at the base of the world's tallest seated bronze Buddha and visit a model of Noah's Ark. In fact, you will find yourself uttering "only in Hong Kong" a lot, whether scaling a steep hillside on a funicular tramway to Victoria Peak, dining on dim sum at one of the world's cheapest Michelin-starred restaurants or perusing goldfish at the Tung Choi Street Goldfish Market.

HANOI (HA LONG BAY), VIETNAM

1 OVERNIGHT | 6-7 APRIL 2022

Standing in front of the French colonial architecture of the opera house and St. Joseph's Cathedral inspired by Notre Dame, you will feel like you are in Paris instead of Southeast Asia. Then Vietnam's culture unfolds in the 11th-century architecture of the Imperial Citadel and Temple of Literature and in Ba Dinh Square, where Ho Chi Minh read the Proclamation of Independence in 1945. Equally unforgettable is the natural beauty of Ha Long Bay, a magnificent UNESCO-listed landscape dotted with hundreds of limestone islands.



Overnight DESTINATION HIGHLIGHTS

HUE (CHAN MAY), VIETNAM

1 OVERNIGHT | 8-9 APRIL 2022

In Chan May you are ideally situated between centuries of history dating to the Nguyen Dynasty in Hue and the modern tumult of the 20th century in Da Nang. The vast Complex of Hue Monuments follows the natural beauty of the Perfume River from a walled imperial city to ornate temples and tombs. This UNESCO site offers a look at Vietnam before the 20th century, but you will also see evidence of the Vietnam War in the bombed remains of the Forbidden Purple City.

SAIGON (HO CHI MINH CITY), VIETNAM

1 OVERNIGHT | 11-12 APRIL 2022

A lot has changed since the iconic evacuation photos were taken during the fall of Saigon in 1975 — including its name, Ho Chi Minh City. Nowhere is the evolution more obvious than when you view the city from the 81st-floor observation deck of Vietnam's tallest building. Still, Ho Chi Minh City retains its unique culture and wears its battle scars with honour. You will experience this in the elaborate French colonial architecture and grand arches of the 19th-century post office as well as the Cu Chi Tunnels built during the war. Explore Vietnam's history in the fascinating museums and pagodas, and watch modern life unfold in bustling markets.

BANGKOK, THAILAND

1 OVERNIGHT | 15-16 APRIL 2022

Bangkok has fabulous streets in which to get lost – and to eat. As you explore, notice what is missing as well as what is there, for you will find a distinct absence of ancient relics and European colonial influence. At the Grand Palace you may detect an occasional Western flourish, but this royal compound undeniably salutes the craftsmanship and

creativity of Thailand. Staring at the massive gold Buddha in the young city's oldest temple, you will note that it dates only to the 18th century. To explore ancient history, visit Bangkok's excellent museums or travel north to the ruins of Ayutthaya, the historic capital of Siam.

YANGON, MYANMAR


2 OVERNIGHTS | 23-25 APRIL 2022

Formerly known as Rangoon, Yangon is the largest city in Myanmar and yet retains an old-school feel that is rare for a city of millions. You will find more quaint colonial buildings than slick skyscrapers, and its most famous structure – the heavenly Shwedagon Pagoda – is about 2,600 years old. Beyond that golden icon, the gilded Sule and Botataung Pagodas are also worth visiting. To get an authentic feel for the entire city, the Yangon Circular Railway makes a three-hour loop around town and gives you the chance to rub elbows – literally – with the locals. When you need to refuel, try a bowl of mohinga, a delicious fish soup with rice noodles.

MAHÉ, SEYCHELLES

2 OVERNIGHTS | 5-7 MAY 2022

On any given day in Mahé, the combined residents and tourists number only in the thousands, which means you will not have to stray too far to get off the beaten path. Even when standing squarely on the beaten path at the island's most popular resort beach, there is plenty of room to relax on the sugary white sands and snorkel in impossibly blue waters. You will not find many – or any – lines in the museums, gardens and markets of Victoria, so explore at will. Then venture along roads lined with palm and flowering trees to find your favourite spot within the island's renowned beaches, lush tropical forests and picturesque tea and spice plantations.



CAPE TOWN, SOUTH AFRICA

1 OVERNIGHT | 20-21 MAY 2022

Arriving in Cape Town, your options for an extraordinary day are as diverse as the cultures that have left their mark on this city. Get your heart pounding on a cage dive with great white sharks or stay ashore and relax as you enjoy high tea at the posh Mount Nelson Hotel. You will find the views from Signal Hill are even more stunning in the setting sun, and the flavours of Stellenbosch wines are enhanced by artisanal chocolates. Wherever you choose to explore, Table Mountain looms majestically in the background, whether you are discovering the legacy of apartheid on Robben Island or admiring the colourful houses in the Bo-Kaap neighbourhood.

TILBURY, UK

1 OVERNIGHT | 19-20 JUNE 2022

Surveying the chaotic web of London's streets – over 1,554 square kilometres of them – it seems as though none of them lead out of the city. And why would they, as everything you could want is here,

from castles to cathedrals and paintings to parks. Human history unfolds at the unrivalled British Museum, while residents and visitors opine at Hyde Park's Speakers' Corner. Find world-class theatre in London's West End and a parade of history's greatest artists in any one of its art museums. In this melting pot of world cultures, dine on anything from Japanese, Chinese, Indian and Turkish to modern takes on classics like fish and chips and pork pie.

AMSTERDAM, NETHERLANDS

1 OVERNIGHT | 21-22 JUNE 2022

In a city where almost everything is extraordinary in some way, Amsterdam is a blank canvas on which to make your own masterpiece of a visit. Behold the largest collections of Vincent Van Gogh works, handbags and all things cat related – in separate museums, of course. Marvel at the photogenic townhouses that line the city's canals or a urinal so beautiful it was designated a national monument. Hop on a canal boat, rent a bike or head out on foot in any direction and you will stumble on something unforgettable, like an ancient cathedral, a park carpeted in flowers, a world-class museum or the iconic windmills that dot the Dutch landscape.

NEW YORK, NEW YORK

1 OVERNIGHT | 4-5 JULY 2022

New York is a town like no other — a city of high energy and controlled chaos with a tough exterior and a huge heart, where a million things may be happening around you, but they all get tuned out when you find yourself standing on a street corner eating the best slice of pizza you have ever had. The largest metropolitan area in the U.S., it is also a place of superlatives, attracting the best in fields from the creative arts to science to business. The list of attractions is nearly endless, and none will disappoint: Broadway shows, the American Museum of Natural History, Greenwich Village, the Brooklyn Bridge, Chelsea Market and so much more.







Optional OVERLAND TOURS

ROMANTIC ESCAPE FROM BORA BORA

2 DAY | 23 JANUARY 2022

Few islands in the world are as idyllic and blissful as Bora Bora, where you will luxuriate in complete comfort at the Conrad Bora Bora Nui Resort. With jungle-draped Mount Otemanu as a backdrop and the turquoise sea beckoning in every other direction, the resort exudes romance and it is even more atmospheric in the evening. You will be free to do as you please the entire time. You might relax on the terrace of your private overwater bungalow, stroll the powdery beach and take a refreshing swim in the sea and infinity pool. If you are feeling more industrious, you will be welcome to snorkel the crystal-clear waters, paddle about in a classic Polynesian outrigger canoe and explore the nearby private island Motu Tapu.

STEPPING BACK IN TIME FROM AUCKLAND

3 DAY | 4 FEBRUARY 2022

Discover the charms of the Great Barrier Island, a wonderfully undeveloped oasis that shelters Auckland from the swells of the Pacific Ocean. Almost every activity revolves around the natural world, which is fiercely protected throughout. A local will introduce you to the sizeable island and describe the unique flora and fauna as you walk into the bush and along the sugar-white beaches. You will hear about the Maori settlers. the miners that followed and the whalers once based there. A chartered boat will bring you to some of New Zealand's best fishing grounds just offshore, where you will have a good chance of catching lunch. Be sure to star-gaze nightly, as the island is a Dark Sky Sanctuary where the constellations look close enough to touch.

OFF THE BEATEN PATH FROM TAURANGA


2 DAY | 5 FEBRUARY 2022

Head into some of the lesser-known, but no less spectacular areas of the North Island for a genuine look at Kiwi country life. In the fertile Waikato region, you will tour a tea estate with more than a million plants. Creativity also flourishes as you will discover at a gallery that showcases local artists and at an outdoor garden full of blown-glass sculptures and flowers. Some of New Zealand's finest Bordeaux-style red wine is produced near Hawke's Bay, and you will have the opportunity to sample an inspired selection after a behind-the-scenes tour of Church Road Winery. An earthquake in 1931 almost entirely destroyed the nearby town of Napier, but it rebounded by rebuilding in an Art Deco style. Today, Napier boasts one of the world's largest districts.

NEW ZEALAND'S SOUTHERN GRANDEUR FROM DUNEDIN

2 DAY | 9 FEBRUARY 2022

Travel into the hinterlands of the South Island to explore charming little towns and some of New Zealand's most unusual natural wonders. Besides being quaint, the diminutive village of Clyde is a literal powerhouse, as it is home to one of the country's largest hydroelectric dams. Arrowtown is another inland treasure, where you can wander the heritage main street before enjoying an evening lake cruise on a historical steamship in the Southern Alps. You will view other natural attractions from a skyline gondola and by hiking to The Chasm, a roaring waterfall in the rainforest. Walking through a cavern illuminated by thousands of tiny glowworms may be even more remarkable. For manmade attractions, few top Homer Tunnel, which cuts through solid rock beneath the soaring Darran Mountains.



MAGICAL ULURU: AYERS ROCK **OVERLAND FROM SYDNEY**

4 DAY | 14 FEBRUARY 2022

Discover the wonders of Ayers Rock, a massive sandstone monolith known as Uluru among the Anangu Aboriginal people that hold it sacred. The rock dominates a flat plain within the Uluru-Kata Tjuta National Park, and it changes colours throughout the day. You will watch a pyrotechnic sunrise there and a glorious sunset, during which you will dine on native bushfood and hear tales of Uluru's spirituality, accompanied by the sound of a didgeridoo. You will also explore Kata Tjuta, a cluster of soaring rock domes nearby that the Anangu consider sacred. The national park is so outstanding that UNESCO declared it a dual World Heritage site for its natural and cultural values. You can learn even more about the Aboriginal culture through dance and musical demonstrations at your resort hotel.



EXPLORING THE GREAT BARRIER REEF OVERLAND FROM SYDNEY

4 DAY | 14 FEBRUARY 2022

Experience the very best of the Whitsundays, a collection of idyllic islands in the heart of the Great Barrier Reef. Most of the islands are uninhabited national parks where nature rules, even at the luxurious resort hotel that will be your home base on serene Hayman Island. While you will enjoy free time there to indulge in watersports, the real adventures await you during day trips. You will snorkel at two spectacular sections of the reef that will be teeming with schools of colourful fish and graceful sea turtles. On another inspired outing, you will while away the hours on Whitehaven Beach, a long stretch of bright crystal-white sand that is among the purest in the world. The Whitsundays are all about enjoying outdoor fun.



Optional OVERLAND TOURS

HIGHLIGHTS OF BEIJING & THE TERRACOTTA WARRIORS FROM SHANGHAI

5 DAY | 30 MARCH 2022

Visit a remarkable array of iconic attractions in and around Beijing and come away with clear understanding of the capital's historical and cultural importance. Bring along your bucket list, as you will be checking off one landmark after another. You will visit the Temple of Heaven, where the emperors prayed for bumper harvests, sprawling Tiananmen Square and the fortified Forbidden City that served as China's imperial palace for nearly five centuries - and that is just in one day. You will also walk the impregnable section of the Great Wall that spans Juyong Pass before flying inland to Xi'an. What a thrill to browse its Terracotta Warriors Museum, a repository for thousands of clay soldiers that were buried with China's first emperor to accompany him in his eternal rest.

ARMIES OF THE FIRST EMPEROR FROM SHANGHAI

3 DAY | 31 MARCH 2022

Browse one of the world's greatest archaeological discoveries at the Terracotta Warriors Museum in Xi'an, which holds thousands of life-size clay soldiers and horses that once guarded the nearby tomb of China's first emperor. Buried for 2,000 years, the clay figures were not found until 1974. Incredibly, each one was created individually with unique characteristics, grouped by battle order, armed with weapons and then covered with earth to protect the deceased Emperor Qin. You will also see the intact ancient wall that stretches around Xi'an, a monumental structure with nearly 100 ramparts. Meandering through the Big Wild Goose Pagoda will reveal the long influence of Buddhism in this area, as it was first constructed in the 7th century. The brick pagoda soars seven stories, but was built without cement.

HOMETOWN OF THE GIANT PANDA FROM SHANGHAI

3 DAY | 31 MARCH 2022

Watch giant pandas at a conservation and scientific research centre that breeds these highly endangered animals for possible release into the wild. Featuring the world's largest collection of pandas – more than 100 live at the facility – you will observe these beloved creatures as they eat, play and interact with each other in a setting that replicates their natural habitat. Pandas are indigenous to the mountains of central China, but their numbers are so low that they have come to symbolise vulnerable species. This is a rare chance to see so many giant pandas at once. To enhance your understanding of this part of China, you will also browse the Sanxingdui Museum, a repository of stunning artefacts from the ancient kingdom of Shu.

RISING DRAGON: HANOI EXPERIENCE FROM HA LONG BAY

2 DAY | 6 APRIL 2022

Take a definitive look at Hanoi by visiting ancient religious sites and locales that reflect Vietnam's more recent history. The city's oldest Buddhist shrine, Tran Quoc Pagoda soars 11 stories over an islet on West Lake. Similarly, Ngoc Son Temple perches lakefront on Jade Island, but it commemorates a 13th-century military hero rather than a religious figure. The Temple of Literature is another historical highlight, as it was constructed as a university in 1070 to honour Confucius. While you will also visit the infamous Hanoi Hilton, where American POWs were held during the Vietnam War, much of this excursion's second day will be devoted to Ho Chi Minh, North Vietnam's president. You will view his mausoleum and the stilt house where he lived until his death in 1969.

INSIDE ANGKOR WAT AND HOI AN FROM CHAN MAY


4 DAY | 8 APRIL 2022

This enlightening immersion into the history and culture of Southeast Asia begins by browsing the Cham Museum in Da Nang, where you will gain an understanding of Vietnam's indigenous Cham people. Similarly, the ancient city of Hoi An will reveal what life was like in coastal Vietnam in the 15th to 19th centuries, as it resembles a trading port from that time period. Hoi An is so authentic that UNESCO declared it a World Heritage site. Here you will enjoy a cooking class of local delicacies and private Tai Chi session. After flying into Cambodia, you will explore the temples of the Khmer Empire at Angkor, another World Heritage site. Built in the 12th century, Angkor Wat is considered the world's largest religious monument, while the fortified Angkor Thom complex includes the remains of temples such as Bayon and palaces befitting the empire's last capital. In the evening you are treated to a unique and vibrant performance by Phare, the Cambodian Circus troupe.

VIEWS OF VIETNAM FROM CHAN MAY

3 DAY | 9 APRIL 2022

Once the imperial city of the Nguyen emperors, Hue still enchants, as you will discover at the 19th-century Royal Citadel and the lavish Palace of Supreme. A dragon boat cruise down the meandering Perfume River will present a different side of Hue, as will visiting one of its holiest pagodas. Da Nang is equally impressive, especially its enlightening Cham Museum and the picturesque Marble Mountains. It also offers easy access to Hoi An, a World Heritage site that is an exceptionally well-preserved example of a centuries-old trading port. A flight to Ho Chi Minh City, more commonly known as Saigon, will give you the chance to see an array of remarkable attractions, including the Reunification Palace and Notre Dame, a Romanesque-style cathedral that French colonists built.





Optional OVERLAND TOURS

SIMPLY ANGKOR WAT FROM HO CHI MINH CITY

3 DAY | 12 APRIL 2022

Enjoy a comprehensive exploration of the Angkor Archaeological Park, an acclaimed World Heritage site with abundant temples built in the 9th to 15th centuries as part of the Khmer Empire. The centrepiece is famed Angkor Wat, one of the largest religious monuments ever constructed. Originally a Hindu temple dedicated to the god Vishnu, it was converted into a Buddhist temple and has become so iconic that its image appears on the flag of Cambodia. You will also meander the ruins of the enormous stone faces in the Angkor Thom complex and marvel at Ta Prohm, a temple famously being overtaken by the roots of strangler fig trees. The setting is so dramatic that it has been featured in movies such as *Lara Croft: Tomb Raider*.

ANCIENT TEMPLES OF BAGAN FROM YANGON

2 DAY | 23 APRIL 2022

Gain insight into the religious devotion of Myanmar's people by visiting several ancient temples that are representative of the thousands of temples built across the plains of Bagan in the 9th through 13th centuries. Ananda Temple is considered a masterpiece of Mon architecture, while Sulamani Temple displays some of Bagan's finest ornamental work. The gold-plated Shwezigon Pagoda is another architectural gem from the same time period and is so stunning that its design became the prototype for countless pagodas that followed. Bagan is also renowned for lacquerware, and you will have the opportunity to watch artisans create various pieces step by step using traditional methods. For a candid glimpse into daily life, you will visit an open-air market and interact with the local residents.

AUTHENTIC INLE LAKE FROM YANGON

2 DAY | 23 APRIL 2022

Delve into the lifestyle of the local Intha people at Inle Lake, a beautiful body of water known throughout Myanmar for its unusual floating villages and gardens. While you will first stop at the sacred Buddhist site of Shwedagon Pagoda, Inle Lake life will take centre stage from that point on. There will be plenty to observe as you travel by boat to explore a mobile market that rotates between water villages every five days. You will also see fishermen that stand in their boats on one leg, adeptly row with their other leg wrapped around an oar and work their conical nets with their hands. It is a sight to behold, as will be the villages built on stilts above the water and the monastery on Inle Lake.

MOUNT EVEREST & THE TAJ MAHAL FROM YANGON

5 DAY | 25 APRIL 2022


See the world's highest mountain from the air and the magnificent Taj Mahal at different times of the day, as the ivory-white mausoleum appears to change colours. As an introduction to the Nepalese way of life, you will first explore the area around Kathmandu, including the royal city of Patan. You will behold the living goddess considered a reincarnation of a Hindu goddess, sit in on a meditative singing bowl workshop and visit a sacred Thangka painting studio. A flight over the Himalayas will present Mount Everest, known in Tibet as the "mother goddess of the world," from a glorious perspective. Architecture then takes centre stage as you explore holy sites in two World Heritage cities before flying to Agra, home to the Taj Mahal, arguably the world's most beautiful building.



VICTORIA FALLS DISCOVERY FROM MAPUTO

5 DAY | 16 MAY 2022

Behold thundering Victoria Falls and observe Africa's extraordinary wildlife on game drives in the neighbouring reserve. Victoria Falls is a magnificent natural wonder, as it is considered to be the world's largest cascade and is so loud that it can be heard from 40 kilometres away. Scottish missionary and explorer David Livingstone named the falls for Queen Victoria in 1855. The Zambezi River is its source, and you will see the waterway in all its glory on a leisurely sunset cruise. Morning and afternoon game drives in the African bush will present the opportunity to view the country's most iconic wildlife, such as lions, elephants and rhinos. You will also have the option to try other activities such as fishing and canoeing the Zambezi River.



BEST OF TWO WORLDS: KRUGER PARK FROM MAPUTO

5 DAY | 16 MAY 2022

Travel through two of Africa's premier reserves on game drives to observe the country's most iconic animals in their natural habitats. Kruger National Park is South Africa's largest game reserve and the chances are excellent of seeing the Big Five - lions, elephants, leopards, rhinos and Cape buffalo. It is also home to the Little Five and the birding Big Six, a diversity of animals that are among the most exciting to watch, especially from the comfort of an openair 4x4 vehicle. The animals roam freely between Kruger and Sabi Sands Game Reserve, where you will also venture out on game drives. Sabi Sands has the distinction of being home to the highest, most diverse concentration of wildlife in the Southern Hemisphere.

Optional OVERLAND TOURS

BIYELA HLUHLUWE SAFARI FROM RICHARDS BAY

4 DAY | 17 MAY 2022

Drive through South Africa's oldest game reserve in an open-air 4x4 vehicle that allows for unobstructed views of the quintessential wildlife. Once the exclusive hunting grounds of Zulu monarch Shaka, the reserve is now renowned for its rhino conservation and for the abundance of other animals. The Big Five – lions, elephants, leopards, rhinos and Cape buffalo - are often spotted here, and you will have plenty of chances to see them on earlymorning and afternoon game drives. When out in the bushveld enjoying sundowners and snacks late in the day, you may observe species that become much more active as the sun sets. You will stay at Biyela Lodge, a magnificent property overlooking the Umfolozi River, from which you may watch animals drinking below.

ANDERSSONS AT ETOSHA'S ONGAVA RESERVE FROM CAPE TOWN

4 DAY | 21 MAY 2022

Observe Africa's most iconic animals in their natural habitats on game drives that will bring you remarkably close to these magnificent creatures. From the luxurious lodge Anderssons at Ongava, you can easily reach neighbouring Ongava Game Reserve to view animals such as lions, giraffe and Hartmann's mountain zebra. White and black rhinos have successfully been reintroduced to the reserve, and chances are you will also see them roaming freely. Etosha National Park is close by, and you will have the opportunity to observe countless animals gathered there. Few places support such large numbers of wildebeest, springboks and endemic



black-faced impalas. Birds are just as plentiful, as the reserve and park are teeming with ostriches, raptors, shrikes and hundreds of other avian species.

SWAKOPMUND & SOSSUSVLEI EXPERIENCE FROM CAPE TOWN

4 DAY | 21 MAY 2022

Explore Namibia's stark but hauntingly beautiful desert, a landscape of surprising diversity and nuance. While in coastal Swakopmund, you will travel in a 4x4 vehicle to Welwitschia Plains, a lunar-like terrain that centuries-old welwitschia plants dominate. A flight to Sossusvlei will bring you to NamibRand Nature Reserve, another spectacular desert setting that you will traverse by vehicle, bicycle or by walking. Whichever way, it will be an extraordinary experience. As Africa's first International Dark Sky Reserve, the area is one of the world's best places to star-gaze. Towering dunes are the main attraction in Namib-Naukluft National Park, a wonderland that will become even more alluring with the naturalist guide providing commentary. Time will also be allotted for you to luxuriate at the Sossusvlei Desert Lodge.
