Along the way, enjoy the tastes of the southern coast and indulge in fresh regional seafood and hand-selected local wines.

# ITINERARY: 10 NIGHTS > ADELAIDE TO ADELAIDE

#### DAY 1: DEPART ADELAIDE

Board Coral Geographer at 4:00pm for 5:00pm departure.

#### **DAYS 2-10**

Your Expedition Team may make changes to the itinerary in order to maximise your expedition experience. Below are the key destinations we visit.

#### TROUBRIDGE ISLAND

Troubridge Island Conservation Park is an important breeding area for birds and is home to a large colony of little penguins, black-faced cormorants, and crested terns – an ideal environment for bird enthusiasts. Spend the morning relaxing on the white-sand beaches, or visit the site of the lighthouse, built in 1856. This evening, watch the sunset light up the rocky coast as we cruise past Cape Jervis.

#### ANTECHAMBER BAY, KANGAROO IS

Antechamber Bay is one of Kangaroo Island's finest coastal havens. Here, enjoy beach walks along the bay or swim in the turquoise water. Spend time hiking the rocky headland to the Cape Willoughby Light Station, circled by crashing waves, and also tour the Lighthouse Keeper's cottage.

#### WESTERN RIVER COVE

Today, land at isolated Western River Cove to visit the beautiful historic homestead, and observe the effects of the recent bushfires and subsequent recovery. There may be an opportunity to meet the homestead owners and hear their stories. A walk along the ridge reveals spectacular views of the valley, and the beach offers excellent snorkelling or swimming. Weather permitting, visit beautiful Kangaroo Beach. Later, cruise past the sea cliffs at Cape Borda for wonderful views.

#### LINCOLN NATIONAL PARK & MEMORY COVE

The Lincoln National Park is cloaked in windswept eucalypt and she-oak forests, home to many bird species, including the rare western whipbird. At Memory Cove, stroll through dense bushland and emerge atop the cliffs to enjoy spectacular views of the Southern Ocean and the islands scattered throughout the Spencer Gulf. This evening, cruise past Cape Catastrophe and along Whaler's Way, hearing the fascinating stories of this rugged coastline and observing the sunset light up the spectacular cliffs.

#### COFFIN BAY NATIONAL PARK

The pristine waters of Coffin Bay are home to numerous pods of dolphins, sea lions, and seals. Emus and kangaroos roam and the natural beauty of this area is the backdrop to your day's adventures.

Here, enjoy an unforgettable food experience - hop into some waterproof waders and take a seat at the Saltwater Pavilion to shuck and taste your own delicious Coffin Bay Oysters.

Later, hike through the Coffin Bay National Park and enjoy interpretation of the landscape, and snorkel or kayak with the chance to spot some of the marine life. We may visit 7 Mile Beach to wander through the beautiful dunes.

#### FLINDERS ISLAND

Located around 35kms from the Eyre Peninsula Coast, Flinders Island has a long history of sealing, whaling, and farming. Owned by the Woolford family since 1979, they run an established sheep farm, abalone harvesting business and are working to establish a Safe Haven for vulnerable native species. Meet the Woolford family to learn about the history and conservation projects on the island. Visit the *Kapara* shipwreck at Bryant's Bay, and stroll through the shearing sheds at the farm. Taste fresh abalone and other local seafood at Eyrewoolf Abalone. This evening, cruise past protected Pearson Island in the light of the setting sun.

#### **TUMBY BAY**

At Tumby Bay, explore the quaint farming town on a walk to take in the many murals that have been painted here. Enjoy a mangrove walk also to experience the peaceful natural environment.

#### **CAPE DONINGTON & REEVESBY ISLAND**

Start your day with a visit to Reevesby Island that reveals the history of this remote region. Visit an important seabird breeding site and hike to the historic homestead. This chain of islands offers sheltered bays, golden sand beaches and reefs teeming with marine life. Later, enjoy a refreshing dip at Cape Donington before hiking to Stamford Hill and the Flinders Monument. Spot western grey kangaroos, emus or goannas, or see long-nosed fur seals or Australian sea lions on the rocks.

#### WEDGE ISLAND

The rich sea-life around these islands attracts top predators including white pointers, and we might spot marine activity as we cruise to Wedge Island. This island was used as a secret radar station during WWII. Wedge Island is also home to unique Australian fauna – you might spot endangered Bettong, Fairy Penguins, Rock Wallabies, Emus, Wombats, and a large variety of bird species. This evening, enjoy sunset drinks as we cruise past the Althorpe Island Lighthouse.


#### DAY 11: ARRIVE ADELAIDE

This morning, we arrive in Adelaide at 7:30am to disembark at 8:00am. A post cruise transfer is included to the CBD or airport.

#### TRIP LOG


"We took to the Vista Deck for our pre-dinner drinks just as the Pearson Islands loomed off the starboard bow. From the ship's rail, we enjoyed the marvels of these imposing island peaks - home to an endemic rock wallaby species, plus significant reptile, and bird fauna. The Baudin Expedition named the islands *Les Enfants perdus* - the lost children. Even in silhouette against the setting sun, with gauzy ocean spray rising from their flanks, these islands were captivating. Studded with sculptural granite forms and thick casuarina woodland, it's little wonder that they have attracted such keen scientific scrutiny. As dinner was being served, a gaudy sunset with every fiery hue possible straddled the western horizon, prompting many diners - including the Master - to abandon their meals for a photo."

## ITINERARY: 13 NIGHTS > BETWEEN FREMANTLE AND ADELAIDE

#### DAY 1: DEPART FREMANTLE OR ADELAIDE

Board in Fremantle at 4:00pm for a 5:00pm departure. Board in Adelaide at 4:00pm for a 5:00pm departure.

#### DAYS 2-13: KEY DESTINATIONS OF YOUR EXPEDITION

Your Expedition Team may make changes to the itinerary in order to maximise your expedition experience. Each direction has slight differences to allow for timing, winds and tides.

#### CAPE NATURALISTE & DUNSBOROUGH

Cape Naturaliste is known for its spectacular scenery and some of the best walking tracks in the Margaret River Region. Today explore these walking trails, and visit the Cape Naturaliste Lighthouse before spending some free time in the charming town of Dunsborough. Later, visit stunning Meelup Beach for sunbathing and swimming, followed by sunset drinks on the beach.

#### HAMELIN BAY & MARGARET RIVER

Hamelin Bay, a serene sandy bay, is famous for the abundance of stingrays that swim in the shallows. Snorkel or wade alongside these giant rays, before a walk to a nearby lake for birdwatching. Spend the afternoon in the beautiful Margaret River wine region, and relax on a luxury coach tour to enjoy tastings and cellar-door visits at leading wineries.

#### **AUGUSTA**

Augusta is our gateway to the naturally beautiful South West. Today, climb the historic Cape Leeuwin Lighthouse, built in 1896, and discover the exploration history of the region. Explore Jewel Cave, known for its crystal-encrusted decorations of delicate helectites and stalagmites. Later, enjoy free time to explore the township.

# BREAKSEA ISLAND & ARPENTEUR NATURE RESERVES (Fremantle to Adelaide voyage only)

Named for its weather-beaten appearance and the protection it offers, Breaksea island is home to playful and curious fur seals and Australian sea lions. Spend time observing them in their natural habitat. This afternoon, explore Arpenteur Nature Reserves to spot rare birds including the Red-winged Fairy-wren and New Holland honey-eater, and swim from the beach.

#### ALBANY (Adelaide to Fremantle voyage only)

Discover the town of Albany with a choice between the whaling station tour on the edge of Torndirrup National Park, or the Point Possession Heritage Trail along the cliffs to enjoy magnificent views. Later, learn the history at the Brig Amity Replica and Museum of the Great Southern.

#### **BREMER BAY & POINT ANN**

This tiny coastal town is renowned for having some of the most beautiful beaches in the world. Spend the afternoon swimming, snorkelling or relaxing on the beach. The tranquility of the surroundings, and the opportunity to observe the unique marine life of the area, make Bremer Bay a memorable stop.

In the afternoon we visit Point Ann, located in the Fitzgerald National Park. The Point Ann platform is known to be a good vista for lookouts, while the 1.5km easy bush walk follows the site of the original rabbit proof fence, with superb views over Point Charles Bay. (Fremantle to Adelaide voyage only)

#### WOODY ISLAND, RECHERCHE ARCHIPELAGO

The Recherche Archipelago is a vast group of islands and rocky outcrops scattered across the blue waters of the Southern Ocean. Explore Woody Island for hiking and birdwatching, and experience the snorkel trail at Shearwater Bay.

#### LUCKY BAY & CAPE LE GRAND NATIONAL PARK

Known for massive granite peaks, rolling heath-lands and sweeping beaches, Lucky Bay is popular with kangaroos who laze on its soft white sand. We will enjoy a swim or hike a section of the Le Grand Coastal Trail, where you may spot pygmy possums, western grey kangaroos and many native wildflowers. As the sun sets, enjoy beach drinks with the curious kangaroos.

#### YOKINUP BAY & CAPE ARID NATIONAL PARK

The pristine and remote wilderness of Cape Arid is an important conservation area for 1,100 species of plants and more than 160 bird species. Relax on Yokinup Bay's broad white beaches washed by blue seas, and birdwatch at Thomas River estuary. We may have the opportunity to explore historic whaling station ruins.

#### **GREAT AUSTRALIAN BIGHT**

Our crossing of the Great Australian Bight is an exciting moment for those who love the sea. The Great Australian Bight Marine Park protects southern right whales and is home to 80% of the Australian sea lion population.

NUYTS ARCHIPELAGO (Adelaide to Fremantle voyage only)

Today, arrive at the marine reserve of the Nuyts Archipelago. Once the location of whaling and sealing activity, today the Archipelago is a Conservation Park for endangered species. Spot wildlife including numerous birds and native marsupials, sea eagles, Australian sea lions, penguins, fur seals and dolphins.

#### STREAKY BAY (Fremantle to Adelaide voyage only)

Streaky Bay and surrounding regions are known for their great variety of landscapes, from untouched native scrub land and farming land to cliffs and surf beaches. This morning, enjoy a walking tour of the town, ending at the museum.

#### **COFFIN BAY**

We arrive in tranquil Coffin Bay this morning to swim, snorkel or kayak, looking out for marine life as we explore the water ways. This afternoon, experience a once-in-a-lifetime culinary experience at Coffin Bay Oyster Farm. Done waders and sit at the Saltwater Pavilion to taste oysters fresh out of the sea and learn how to shuck an oyster. Prepare for a seafood taste sensation!

#### KANGAROO ISLAND (Adelaide to Fremantle voyage only)

Today, discover the northern coastline of Kangaroo Island, where feelings of space and freedom fill the senses and steep cliffs give way to white-sand beaches. Swim in the clear waters of Emu Bay and visit secluded Stokes Bay, where a rock-enclosed pool provides a protected swimming spot. Stroll along the beach looking for penguins, dolphins, or seals.

#### DAY 14: ARRIVE ADELAIDE

Disembark in Adelaide at 2:30pm Disembark in Fremantle at 8:00am

A post cruise transfer to the CBD or airport is included (Fremantle, Perth & Adelaide).

### ITINERARY: 14 NIGHTS > MELBOURNE TO FREMANTLE

#### DAY 1: DEPART MELBOURNE

Board in Melbourne at 4:00pm for a 5:00pm departure.

#### DAYS 2-14: KEY DESTINATIONS OF YOUR EXPEDITION

#### APOLLO BAY & TWELVE APOSTLES

Apollo Bay is surrounded by wineries and famous for seafood. Today, a leisurely walk takes us to the Great Ocean Road Brewery to enjoy their unique beers, along with regional wines and boutique gins from local distilleries. Return to the *Coral Geographer* for lunch on the deck while cruising to the 12 Apostles. If conditions permit, get a closer look at the 12 Apostles from the Xplorer. This evening, enjoy Captain's Welcome Drinks while the sunset illuminates the iconic rock formations.

#### **PORT FAIRY**

Port Fairy boasts wide streets lined with beautiful nineteenth century cottages, great Norfolk pines and old stone churches. Spend the day exploring the wonderful 1800's architecture or browse the array of boutiques, antique shops and art & craft stores throughout the town. Follow the Port Fairy Maritime & Shipwreck Heritage Walk to discover white-washed cottages built by whalers, or enjoy the Griffith's Island Nature Walk.

#### WESTERN RIVER COVE, KANGAROO ISLAND

This morning, go ashore at remote Western River Cove. Beachcomb the small crescent-shaped beach and stroll along the river to the historic Homestead. You may have the opportunity to hear the personal story of the homestead owners as they escaped the devastating 2019 fires. An invigorating hike up the ridge line behind the homestead offers spectacular views of the valley. Later, cool off with a snorkel or swim at the beach.

#### **COFFIN BAY**

Coffin Bay is a stunning destination. The pristine waters are home to dolphins and sea lions, while emus and kangaroos roam. Enjoy a once-in-a-lifetime tasting experience - don waterproof waders and take a seat at the Saltwater Pavilion to shuck your own Pacific oysters, fresh from the sea. Later, enjoy a short hike in the Coffin Bay National Park, and swim or kayak with the chance to spot marine life.

#### STREAKY BAY

This morning, stroll through the quaint township of Streaky Bay known for its fine cafes, and pop-up food vans. Visit the streaky Bay National Trust Museum to gain an insight into the town's history. Learn about the history of abalone farming in the region with a visit to the processing plant and an opportunity to taste the delicacy of wild-caught green-lip and black-lip abalone, harvested by hand from the pristine waters of the Eyre Peninsula.

#### **BUNDA CLIFFS & GREAT AUSTRALIAN BIGHT**

The Bunda Cliffs, some 120 metres high, are part of the longest stretch of sea cliffs in the world. We will sail in sight of the cliffs for an awe-inspiring view. On your once-in-a-lifetime crossing of the Great Australian Bight, you may also have the chance to spot the diverse marine wildlife which flourishes here.

#### LUCKY BAY & CAPE LE GRAND NATIONAL PARK

Cape Le Grand National Park's massive granite peaks, rolling heathlands and curving white beaches are a beautiful backdrop for a morning hike on the Le Grand Coastal trail. The beautiful coastal scenery is home to pygmy possums, western grey kangaroos and colourful native wildflowers. Enjoy a dip in the turquoise water of Lucky Bay and meet the friendly kangaroos lazing on the whitest sand in Australia. This afternoon, visit Woody Island in the Recherche Archipelago, to enjoy a bush-walk with spectacular views across the archipelago. Keep an eye out for Golden Whistlers, Brown Quails, Spotted Pardalotes, or Raptors.

#### ALBANY

Best known for its ancient tingle and karri forests, Albany is also alive with history. Arrive after lunch and travel to the Albany War Memorial to pay homage to those whose lives were lost in action. Later, explore at your own pace to take in the colonial buildings, galleries and museums.

#### **AUGUSTA**

Augusta is the most south-western town in Australia. Here, we will climb Cape Leeuwin Lighthouse, the tallest lighthouse on mainland Australia, which overlooks the place where the mighty Southern and Indian Oceans collide. Journey to visit Jewel Cave, an awe-inspiring and well decorated cave, with many beautiful examples of delicate helictites, cave coral, pendulites, and flowstone such as 'The Frozen Waterfall' and 'the Organ-pipes'.

#### CAPE NATURALISTE

Cape Naturaliste is on the western edge of Geographe Bay, and is known for spectacular coastal scenery. The Wardandi people called it *Kwirreejeenungup* - 'the place with the beautiful view'. This morning, explore the beautiful walking trails, and visit the Cape Naturaliste Lighthouse. After lunch, delight in a flight of wines at a renowned Margaret River estate, learning the history and stories of the five founding vineyards of this famous wine region.

#### DAY 11: ARRIVE FREMANTLE

Disembark in Fremantle at 9:00am

A post cruise transfer to the CBD or airport is included (Fremantle and Perth).


